





MARINA

Please keep in mind the following guidelines as you enjoy our boat ramp and marina at Anchorage Park:

Boat Ramp and Boat Trailer Parking: Access to these areas is for permit holders only. To use these amenities, you must be a NPB resident and have a valid boat launch decal permanently affixed to the tongue of your trailer. Be aware that violators could face citations. Low tide of length restrictions?

Boat Repairs by contractors: If you're a resident and are having your boat worked on by a contractor that will need to use the ramp, please inform the office before your contractor intends to use the boat ramp. You may leave a message with the office at (561) 841-3386 or come in on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Commercial loading/unloading: If you're a resident and are arranging permitted work on your seawall, dock, or lift, please inform the office before your contractor intends to use the boat ramp. We are currently discussing the potential need for a separate commercial loading or unloading permit.

Meanwhile, any contractor using the boat ramp should check in at the Anchorage Park Activities building between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Note that commercial usage of the boat ramp is not permitted on weekends and holidays.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. Enjoy your time at the marina!

Fireworks are legal for July 4th, but please be cautious

Fireworks are normally illegal in Florida if they explode like a firecracker, or if they shoot into the air like a bottle rocket. However, Florida law does allow those fireworks on the following three holidays ONLY:

- New Year's Eve
- New Year's Day
- Independence Day (July 4th)

The Village complies with the law and its requirements in every aspect, but it is important for residents to be reminded of the dangerous nature of fireworks. Accordingly, the North Palm Beach Police and Fire Departments urge anyone using fireworks to be extra cautious and to follow safety guidelines, especially about not letting children use these types of fireworks.

Firearms are not fireworks

It is **illegal** to shoot a gun into the air for celebration on any day, including the three holidays noted above. Bullets come down at the same speed as when they left the barrel of the gun, and pose a very serious threat of landing on someone. Every year nationwide, people are injured or killed by falling bullets shot off in celebration.



And if a uniformed or undercover officer, or another citizen witnesses someone shooting a gun, that could lead to a dangerous confrontation or encounter.

It's not worth the risk!

NPB police officers and fire fighters do not want anyone to be hurt or arrested on July 4th this year, so please consider taking their advice seriously.

Fire Department urges caution with personal fireworks

The North Palm Beach Fire Rescue Department is reminding residents that while fireworks can be fun and patriotic, they can also be dangerous.

According to the Health Care District of Palm Beach County, 11 people were treated for traumatic fireworks-related injuries during a recent 1-year period in Palm Beach County. Five were children aged 12–17. Sixty percent of the injuries occurred during July 4th festivities, and 40 percent were related to New Year's Eve.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) reported 8 deaths and about 9,700 injuries from fireworks in 2023. Many injuries involved teens, children, and sparklers, which burn hot enough to melt metal.

Most injuries were burns to hands, faces, and heads. The CPSC says fireworks cause an average of 31,000 fires a year, sending about 7,400 people to emergency rooms nationwide.

High-Risk Age Groups

Individuals most at risk include teenagers (15–19 years old), and children (5–9 years old). Also important to keep in mind, is that 65 percent of those injured are bystanders, so the risks even to non-users are just as serious.


NPBFD tips to ensure a safe celebration:

- Attend Professional Displays: Enjoy fireworks at sanctioned events like the NPB Country Club show.
- Avoid Personal Use: Refrain from using consumer fireworks, especially illegal or homemade types.
- Supervise Children: Never allow children to handle fireworks, including sparklers.
- Stay Sober: Do not use fireworks while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Maintain Distance: Keep a safe distance from lit fireworks and never relight malfunctioning ones.
- Have Water Ready: Keep a bucket of water or hose nearby in case of fire or malfunction.
- Dispose Properly: Soak used fireworks in water before discarding to prevent fires.



The Village Fire Rescue Department wants you to enjoy a great, safe Fourth of July, so keep these easy safety tips in mind while celebrating this special day!

Permit required for door-to-door solicitors in North Palm Beach

If you solicit door to door in the Village, or if sales people are coming to your door, you should be aware that the Village Code of Ordinances requires a Solicitor/ Peddler permit for that kind of activity. Also important to know, is that anyone who is issued a solicitor's permit is required to display an identification card (shown below) while conducting business in the Village.

The I.D. card will have the applicant's photograph and some other basic information.

According to Village Code 17-81, the purpose of the ordinance is to protect residents and their property "by adequately investigating the character and responsibility of itinerant merchants and peddlers traveling from house to house soliciting services and goods and to

preserve peace and tranquility for village residents." Code 17-83 says, "It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to engage in such business or activity within the corporate limits of the village without first obtaining a permit pursuant to this article." Additional requirements apply as well.

If you are unsure of someone soliciting in your neighborhood, call the Code Compliance Division at (561) 841-3365 to check their permit.

If they are refusing to leave your property or are confrontational or otherwise suspicious, then call the police.

Support Clean Water with Vertical Oyster Gardens (VOGs)

A message from the Village Environmental Committee

Oysters do more than provide food, as they're essential to our ecosystem. A single oyster can filter up to 50 gallons of water a day, improving water quality and promoting a healthier environment.

Sadly, oyster populations have plummeted, with 85% of reefs lost due to overharvesting and climate change. But restoration efforts are making a difference!

The Environmental Committee of North Palm Beach has launched an oyster restoration initiative using Vertical Oyster Gardens (VOGs)-strings of oyster shells that provide habitat for oyster larvae, or spat.

These gardens are hung from docks, where they help build new oyster colonies and naturally clean our waterways.

Thanks to strong community support, dozens of VOGs were assembled at a volunteer event

earlier this year and placed in the Earman River. Now, we're expanding the effort.

Join us for a VOG Giveaway!

As part of the Anchorage Away Fishing Tournament on August 2nd at Anchorage Park, we'll be giving away VOGs to residents who want to hang them from their dock. This is a great way to support cleaner water, restore oyster habitats, and get involved in a local environmental effort.

Together, we can build a stronger, healthier marine ecosystem—one oyster at a time.



Residential bulk pickup is done by appointment only

All residential pickup of bulk items in the Village is done only by appointment, but you don't need to be there when our pickup crew arrives.

To schedule a bulk appointment, visit the Village website at www.villageofnfb.org, then click the link for "Trash & Bulk Pickup." Fill out the brief online form to schedule your appointment.

This applies only to bulk items, such as old furniture and appliances. Vegetative yard debris is not a bulk item and will be picked up whenever left in the swale by the property's occupant.

Vegetative debris left by for-hire landscaping crews must be removed by the company.

Debris cut by the resident or homeowner must be put in the swale, clear of powerlines, trees or other obstructions.
