School Zone safety message from the NPB Police Department

Residents: With school starting on Monday, August 11, you can expect more traffic, with plenty of kids walking to schools and bus stops. And expect a lot of school buses transporting students in every Village neighborhood.

Remember: Safety first! Be mindful of your route and the locations of posted "school zones," which require reduced speed limits during morning and afternoon hours. These zones are monitored by traffic officers to ensure safety.

When driving behind a school bus, remember they make frequent stops, so be sure to watch for their flashing lights and extended side stop signs. It's illegal to pass a bus with these signals activated, so always come to a full stop. And buses also stop at railroad crossings, which can temporarily affect traffic flow.

Use caution when passing a bus that seems to have completed its stops—children might unexpectedly cross the street, so a little extra patience is a great idea!

Please drive carefully and help keep our children safe!

Welcome to the Anchorage Park Marina! Please keep in mind the following guidelines as you enjoy our facilities:

Boat Ramp and Boat Trailer Parking: Access to these areas is for permit holders only. To use these amenities, you must be a NPB resident and have a valid boat launch decal permanently affixed to the tongue of your trailer. Be aware that violators could face citations.

Boat repairs by contractors: If you're a resident and are having your boat worked on by a contractor that will need to use the ramp, please inform the office before your contractor intends to use the boat ramp.

You may leave a message with the office at (561) 841-3386

or come in on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Commercial loading/unloading: If you're a resident and are arranging permitted work on your seawall, dock, or lift, please inform the office before your contractor intends to use the boat ramp. We are currently discussing the potential need for a separate commercial loading or unloading permit.

Meanwhile, any contractor using the boat ramp should check in at the Anchorage Park Activities building between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Note that commercial usage of the boat ramp is not permitted on weekends and holidays.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. Enjoy your time at the marina!

Does oyster growth damage concrete seawalls?

A message from the Village Environmental Committee

Does oyster growth damage concrete seawalls? This question has recently been posed to the Village Environmental Committee since there is a lot of interest in oyster restoration.

The short answer to the question is, "No." The best evidence of this is to simply observe concrete seawalls in the Village during a low tide when oyster growth is exposed.

Most of the concrete seawalls in the village are over 60 years old and still standing. More specifically, the portion in the inter-tidal zone where the oysters grow is typically in good condition and undamaged by decades of oyster growth.

When seawalls fail it is typically because of erosion on the backside of the wall and/or broken tie back rods that have rusted. As you travel the village waterways you will notice that more than a few seawalls have new caps, but the portion below, which is covered with oysters, is generally left in place.

To be clear, oysters can foul and damage metal ladders or boat lifts that are left below the water line for an extended period of time. They can also clog storm water drains.

However, oyster growth on vertical concrete seawalls is not damaging to the wall. At least one study suggested that oysters may even provide added



corrosion protection to reinforcing steel in marine reinforced concrete structures.

Perhaps most importantly, oysters play a significant role in filtering our waterways and provide critical habitat for many marine invertebrates, fish and other animals. They also add texture to the wall which helps to absorb wave energy with less reflection back into the waterbody.

It is each homeowner's personal prerogative as to whether or not to scrape oysters off their seawall.

Just know that the more oysters we have in Village waterways, the cleaner and clearer our water will be.

Is your house number easy to see at night?

In the event of an emergency, why not make it easier for emergency responders to locate your home?

The Village requires every residence and business to have its address number posted prominently on the building so that police officers, firefighters and other emergency responders can quickly locate the building in an emergency.

The standards for house numbers are set by the National Fire Protection Association. Here are some excerpts from their fire code:

- NFPA 1, 10.11.1.1 New and existing buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property.
- NFPA 1, 10.11.1.2 Address numbers shall be a minimum 6 inches high with a minimum stroke width of one-half inch.

- NFPA 1, 10.11.1.7 Address numbers shall contrast with their background.

It's important for every property owner, resident, renter or business in the Village to ensure their house or business address number is easy to find.

Address numbers should be secured in place for easy visibility and expressed in numerals, not spelled out, and not be written in a cursive style.

Dark and rainy conditions make locating emergencies even more difficult, and needless delay adds risk for both the victims and the first responders.

Compliance with this important safety code will eliminate the need for code compliance officers to write violation notices and will be greatly appreciated by those who work to protect the Village day and night.

Fire Code says address numbers shall be a minimum 6 inches high with a minimum stroke width of one-half inch.



Address numbers that are expressed as numerals, like the image on the left, can be read much easier than address numbers that are spelled out as words, like the image on the right. Emergency services personnel should be able to see your house or business number immediately.

Did we miss your trash? Please give our busy crews a little more time before calling

Got a "missed" trash pickup? Please wait until noon before calling. We sometimes get a lot of calls in the morning, but most of the time pickup is still on the way, and our hard-working solid crew needs the morning to visit over 30 miles of Village roads.

Pickup times change, so a 9 a.m. pickup Tuesday might change to 11 a.m. on Thursday. Weather, staffing, and vehicle availability all play a part in the timing!

Residential bulk pickup is done by appointment only

All residential pickup of bulk items in the Village is done only by appointment, but you don't need to be there when our pickup crew arrives.

To schedule a bulk appointment, visit the Village website at www.villageofnpb.org, then click the link for "Trash & Bulk Pickup." Fill out the brief online form to schedule your appointment.

This applies only to bulk items, such as old furniture and appliances. Vegetative yard debris is not a bulk item and will be picked up whenever left in the swale by the property's occupant.

Vegetative debris left by for-hire landscaping crews must be removed by the company.

Debris cut by the resident or homeowner must be put in the swale, clear of powerlines, trees or other obstructions.
