



## Planning a garage sale? A permit is required, but it's free

Garage sales require a simple permit, which is free and can be obtained on the Village website's permitting service, called MyGovernmentOnline (MGO).

Just use the search box near the top of the page at [www.villageofnpb.org](http://www.villageofnpb.org).

The permit limits the number of garage sales at a residence to two times a year for no more than two consecutive days and the hours from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.

How to comply: Homeowners who wish to hold a garage or yard sale can apply for a free permit online here. Permits can be issued Monday through Friday within 24 business hours.

Garage sales cannot be held for more than two consecutive days and can only be operated between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., no more than two times during a year.

One 2-foot by 3-foot sign is permitted



on the premises to direct the public to the garage sale. The sign shall be removed at the end of the last day on which the sale is held and placed no sooner than 24 hours prior to the date of the sale.

### **When is the latest you can submit a permit before the weekend?**

In order for garage sale permits to be approved on time over the weekend, homeowners shall submit the completed application to the permit portal before noon on Friday.

If a permit is received any time after or online, the garage sale may not be approved until the next business day.

### **What if the garage sale gets rained out?**

Code enforcement officials will work with residents to educate and inform first, issuing warnings if necessary.

Repeat offenders may receive a Notice of Violation, and fees will increase if repeated violations or non-compliances are found.

### Quick Notes:

- No more than two permitted garage sales are allowed at the same residence each year.
- Hours of operation: 8 a.m. - 9 p.m.
- One sign permitted on the premises.

Welcome to the Anchorage Park Marina! **Renewals are due by October 1st.**

Please keep in mind the following guidelines as you enjoy our facilities:

**Boat Ramp and Boat Trailer Parking:** Access to these areas is for permit holders only. To use these amenities, you must be a NPB resident and have a valid boat launch decal permanently affixed to the tongue of your trailer. Be aware that violators could face citations.

**Boat repairs by contractors:** If you're a resident and are having your boat worked on by a contractor who needs to use the ramp, please inform the office before your contractor begins using the ramp.

You may leave a message with the office at (561) 841-3386 or come in on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

**Commercial loading/unloading:** If you're a resident and are arranging permitted work on your seawall, dock, or lift, please inform the office before your contractor begins using the ramp. We are currently discussing the potential need for a separate commercial loading or unloading permit.

Meanwhile, any contractor using the boat ramp should check in at the Anchorage Park Activities building between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Note that commercial usage of the boat ramp is not permitted on weekends and holidays.

## Your landscaper is required to remove clippings from property

Did you know that if you hire a landscaper to trim your trees, then the landscaper is required to remove the debris from your property? If you do the work yourself and put the debris out for collection in the swale the Village will pick it up during routine vegetation collection, but when professionals do the work, they must haul away the clippings themselves.

This is important to keep in mind when negotiating a price with the landscaper so you can evaluate what works best for you. All landscapers who are registered to work within Village limits know this, so if you plan to hire someone, it's a good idea to clarify that they will remove the debris when you make an agreement.

### Village Code Section 14-27 (b)4

"All providers of commercial tree trimming and/or landscape maintenance services retained to perform services within the Village shall be registered with the Village's Community Development Department and shall be required to remove all yard waste generated by such tree trimming and/or landscape maintenance activities.



For the purpose of this section, a provider of commercial tree trimming and/or landscape maintenance services shall be defined as a person, group of persons, or entity that routinely engages in, and markets itself as a provider of, such services for a fee."

## Environmental Committee recommends use of mineral sunscreen

The Florida Reef System stretches from the Dry Tortugas to the St. Lucie Inlet, which is almost 350 miles. This is the third largest living barrier reef system in the world. However, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), a substantial amount of the coral species has been lost.

### How is this happening?

The most common contributors to coral death are pollution, overdevelopment, exploitative fishing, and physical damage.

### Why is coral so important?

Coral is known as the lungs of the planet. Without coral the entire marine

ecosystem would be greatly impacted and many aquatic organisms may cease to exist. It is projected that 25% of marine life would lose their habitat, causing fishing industries to suffer.

#### What can you do?

The Environmental Committee recommends that you use "reef-safe" mineral sunscreen, such as zinc oxide, that does not contain chemicals. Sunscreens don't just stay on your skin, as they can enter the ocean and waterways when you swim or shower it off. Think "ZINC" before you apply!

#### The Benefits of Mineral Sunscreen:

- The FDA recognizes zinc oxide and titanium dioxide as safe and effective sunscreen options.
- It's safer on sensitive and acne-prone skin. Mineral

sunscreens don't contain harsh synthetic chemicals and aren't absorbed into your skin.

- It actually provides more protection than synthetic sunscreen.
- The American Academy of Dermatology recommends using a mineral sunscreen (instead of a chemical sunscreen) if you have sensitive or acne-prone skin.

## **A** Avoid Heatstroke

Avoid heatstroke-related injury and death by never leaving a child alone in a car, not even for a minute. And make sure to keep your car locked when you're not inside so kids don't get in on their own.



## **C** Create Reminders

Keep a stuffed animal or other memento in your child's car seat when it's empty, and move it to the front seat as a visual reminder when your child is in the back seat. Or place and secure your phone, briefcase or purse in the backseat when traveling with your child.



## **T** Take Action

If you see a child alone in a car, call 911. Emergency personnel want you to call. They are trained to respond to these situations.

# Everyone can help reduce flood costs & risks

The Village of North Palm Beach participants in the National Flood Insurance (NFIP) Community Rating System, working to maintain a 15% reduction in flood insurance premiums for residents while carrying out flood management measures designed to protect life and property from future flooding.

Here are some ideas to help prepare for hurricane season:

## Flood Safety Measures

For your safety, there is no substitute for advanced planning and preparation for flood events.

- ✓ Do not drive around road barriers. Roads may not be distinguishable from canals. Turn around, don't drown - never drive through flooded areas.
- ✓ Do not walk through flowing water. As little as six inches of moving water can knock you off your feet.
- ✓ Stay away from power lines and electrical wires.
- ✓ Evacuate the area as soon as the order is given or sooner if possible. Evacuation orders are issued because of imminent storm surge, not for wind threat. If evacuation becomes necessary be sure to turn off all utility services at the main connection.
- ✓ Find information on the Village Hurricane Preparation webpage at [www.PrepareTheVillage.com](http://www.PrepareTheVillage.com). There you will find the Palm Beach County Hurricane Evacuation Zone look-up tool, and can find out which Evacuation Zone your property is in. You should know which Evacuation Zone you are in if an evacuation order is issued. Spending a little time now to familiarize yourself with the resources on the website may help avoid a lot of trouble later on.

## Protect your property from flood damage

There are practical and cost-effective methods for reducing or eliminating your property's exposure to flooding.

- ✓ Check your building for water entry points, such as doors, low windows, and dryer vents. These can be protected by the construction of low walls, barriers, or berms to keep water away from the building.
- ✓ You could elevate electrical equipment and furniture, and install backflow valves.
- ✓ Find more information at FEMA's website, [www.Ready.gov/floods](http://www.Ready.gov/floods).
- ✓ Be sure to check with the Village at (561) 841-3365 to see if a building permit is required for flood protection measures. Build responsibly!

Village staff members are available to provide flood-related property protection consultations, including a site visit and drainage evaluation. Call (561) 841-3365 for more information about these services.

## The Cost of Flood Insurance is a "drop in the bucket" compared to the cost of flood damage

Whether or not your property is in a high-risk flood zone, you should consider buying flood insurance. Losses due to flooding are not covered in a typical homeowners' insurance policy. Flood insurance is available for residential and commercial buildings and/or the contents of a building.

Renters should have a flood insurance policy to cover their possessions. Call your insurance agent today, go to [www.FloodSmart.gov](http://www.FloodSmart.gov), or call (800) 427-4661, to find an agent, learn important flood-related information, and to ask your agent to ensure you purchase the coverage you need. There is usually a 30-day waiting period before the policy will become effective.


## Know Your Flood Zone

Call the Village Building Division at (561) 841-3365 to find out if a property is:

- ✓ In a high-risk flood zone
- ✓ Susceptible to coastal erosion
- ✓ In an area that has flooded repeatedly
- ✓ Near an area that should be protected due to its natural floodplain functions
- ✓ On file with an elevation certificate for the building

## Excess Fertilizer = Pollution

Fertilizers make things grow! And that's a good thing if it's your yard. But when excess fertilizer is picked up by rainfall runoff, it is carried to our waterways, where it can cause many water quality problems (like algal blooms)!



## But YOU can help!

- Comply with North Palm Village Codes. Section 27-76 restricts the use of fertilizers containing nitrogen and/or phosphorus between June 1 and October 31, while Section 27-77 restricts applying fertilizer within 10 feet of a body of water.
- Always sweep up fertilizer that has accidentally been applied to hard surfaces.
- Don't apply fertilizer when heavy rainfall is forecast (2" or more).
- Save yourself time and money by converting your landscaping to native South Florida plants that don't require fertilization.

# Olive and Mac return to the sea — and make a splash for conservation

Two young loggerhead sea turtles — Olive and Mac — made their grand return to the Atlantic Ocean recently, released just off the coast of West Palm Beach by the Florida Park Service, Friends of John D. MacArthur Beach State Park, and the ANGARI Foundation.

The duo had spent the past several months serving as sea turtle ambassadors at MacArthur Beach State Park, helping thousands of visitors and students learn about the importance of marine conservation. One-year-old Olive and 10-month-old Mac arrived at the park as hatchlings and were raised by a dedicated team of staff until they were strong enough to swim free.

The Park's ambassador turtle program is part of a larger educational mission that reaches more than 4,000 students each year — all while supporting efforts to preserve Florida's natural coastal habitats.

Park officials credited the Palm Beach International Boat Show "Gives Back" grant program, the Marine Industries Association of Palm Beach County, and the ANGARI Foundation for making the release possible. Their support helps fuel programs that keep sea turtle education afloat and the park's mission alive.



MacArthur Beach State Park is a Marine Turtle Permit Holder under the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and is authorized to care for up to two juvenile loggerheads for educational purposes.

### Residential bulk pickup is done by appointment only

All residential pickup of bulk items in the Village is done only by appointment, but you don't need to be there when our pickup crew arrives.

To schedule a bulk appointment, visit the Village website at [www.villageofnpb.org](http://www.villageofnpb.org), then click the link for "Trash & Bulk Pickup." Fill out the brief online form to schedule your appointment.

This applies only to bulk items, such as old furniture and appliances. Vegetative yard debris is not a bulk item and will be picked up whenever left in the swale by the property's occupant.

Vegetative debris left by for-hire landscaping crews must be removed by the company.

Debris cut by the resident or homeowner must be put in the swale, clear of powerlines, trees or other obstructions.
