Candidates must specify the group number to which he or she is seeking election when filing and qualifying.

Candidate Qualifying Period

Opens: Tuesday, November 18, 2025

Closes: Tuesday, November 25, 2025

A candidate may announce his or her candidacy prior to qualifying; however candidates may not accept contributions or make expenditures until Form DS-DE 9, Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository has been filed with the Village Clerk. After filing Form DS-DE 9 with the Village Clerk, candidates may open their campaign account and begin accepting contributions and making campaign expenditures.

In order to be listed on the ballot, candidates must qualify for office by paying the qualifying fees and submitting the required forms to the Village Clerk during the candidate qualifying period.

Tree Removal Guidelines

The Village has adopted a new **Tree Preservation Ordinance** to help protect native trees & maintain the natural beauty of our neighborhoods.



This ordinance introduces:

- ✓ A Tree Removal Permit process
- ✓ A Tree Trust Fund
- ✓ A Tree Mitigation Program

Permit Required: For removal of protected native trees or any tree located in a swale.

No Permit Needed: For dead trees, trees posing an immediate danger (*with arborist/landscape architect documentation*), invasive species, fruit trees, or routine trimming.

How to Apply:

Complete a **Tree Removal Permit Application** on the Village's website (see link below). Please include a photo or simple sketch of tree's location, then submit your materials to the Building & Zoning Department.

MEET OUR NEW MARINE CODE INSPECTOR

The Village is excited to welcome Rob Perez, our new Marine Code Inspector! Rob will be working to keep our waterways, docks, seawalls, and waterfront properties safe, compliant, and environmentally sound. With nearly 40% of the Village's 5.8 square miles made up of water, his role is a vital part of protecting our community and ensuring our marine resources remain safe for all to enjoy.

Rob's day-to-day work involves conducting inspections, documenting findings, and enforcing local and federal codes on the water. While his primary responsibility is enforcing Chapter 5 – Boats, Docks, and Waterways of the Village Code of Ordinances, you may also see him addressing property maintenance issues or permitting violations observed from the water.

His efforts help ensure that vessels, docks, and seawalls are structurally sound, environmentally compliant, and safe for both residents and visitors.



Because so much of the Village is on the water, it's essential to have someone dedicated to protecting both public safety and the environment. By affirming that marine facilities and vessels meet safety and environmental standards, Rob plays a key role in preserving our quality of life along the waterfront.

Palm Beach International Boat Show Opens Grant Applications to Local Nonprofits

Nonprofits in Palm Beach County can apply now through October 17 for the Palm Beach International Boat Show Gives Back grant program. A total of \$500,000 will be awarded, with up to \$25,000 available per organization for projects that support marine education, cultural events, and waterfront initiatives.

Since launching in 2023, the program has supported 29 local organizations, from student field trips with the Florida Fishing Academy to sea turtle conservation performances by Ballet Palm Beach.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

STAY VISIBLE

Carry glow sticks, flashlights, or wear reflective gear while trick-or-treating.

Talkin' Trash:

Keep Your Veg Pile in Check

Proper yard waste disposal is an important part of keeping our Village clean, safe, and attractive for everyone. If you plan to tackle yard work, please review these guidelines to avoid unexpected violations and extra costs.

Homeowners vs. Contractors

If you maintain your own yard, you may place your vegetation and yard waste in the swale for Village pickup, as long as it follows Village collection standards. If you hire a contractor, lawn service, or tree trimmer, they are legally required to remove and dispose of any debris they create. If they fail to do so, the property owner will be responsible for any cleanup costs and violations.

Basic Yard Waste Requirements

Bagged or Canned: Loose items like grass clippings and leaves must be placed in standard 32-gallon cans or sealed plastic bags weighing no more than 50 pounds each.

Branches and Palm Fronds: Must be cut into lengths no longer than four feet and weigh less than 50 pounds per piece.

Pile Size: Yard waste piles are limited to one pile no larger than eight cubic yards, or approx. 4 ft wide by 15 ft long by 4 feet tall. Oversized piles may not be collected and can result in additional charges.

Placement: Yard waste piles must be placed in the swale for pick up. *Please note that yard waste is not included in bulk pickup requests.*

Storm Season Restrictions: Yard waste should not be generated or placed for collection once a hurricane or tropical storm watch or warning is in effect for any portion of the Village. It will not be picked up by us, but the storm might!

Enforcement and Costs

Putting out yard waste that exceeds the size limits, failing to follow the proper guidelines, or allowing a hired worker to leave debris behind can result in additional collection costs, fines, and liens on your property.

By following these simple steps, you help maintain a safe, clean community for everyone. Know the rules before you pile yard waste and help keep our Village looking its best.



Hands to Heart

HOW CPR TRAINING IS HELPING OUR COMMUNITY

The Village Fire Department invites residents to take part in Hands Only CPR classes, led by Firefighter Frank Rossi and Firefighter Fred Vaccaro. With nearly three years of instruction and more than 350 participants trained, these classes are making a real difference in our community.

Cardiac emergencies can happen anytime, anywhere, and survival often depends on how quickly CPR is started. “We have seen an incredible increase in the viability of our cardiac arrest patients when CPR is started on scene,” explains Firefighter Rossi. “The early use of an AED can be the difference between life and death.”

Both Firefighter Rossi and Firefighter Vaccaro are dedicated to ensuring residents are ready to respond in those critical moments. “The fact that our residents are learning these simple yet lifesaving skills is something we are extremely proud of,” says Firefighter Vaccaro. “Seeing people on calls excited to show us what they have learned makes it all worth it.”

The class is hands-on, straightforward, and open to anyone age 9 and older. Participants practice American Heart Association Hands Only CPR and AED use for adults, children, and infants. Instruction also includes how to respond to choking emergencies, how to recognize allergic

reactions, and how to properly use an EPI pen. Common questions and misconceptions are also addressed so participants leave feeling confident.

These are not just skills for the classroom. Village residents have already saved lives by performing CPR before rescue crews arrived. In one case, a 16-year-old girl who experienced a blackout in her pool was revived because her father immediately began chest compressions. By keeping oxygen circulating until help arrived, she made a full recovery.





If you are hesitant about taking the class, Firefighter Rossi and Firefighter Vaccaro want you to know it is easier than you think. “Doing something is always better than doing nothing for a person in cardiac arrest,” says Firefighter Rossi. “You cannot hurt someone who will not survive without you intervening. We keep the class simple, engaging, and memorable.”

The goal is for every participant to walk away with the confidence to act when it matters most. When in doubt, push hard and fast on the chest, call 911, and stay calm.

The program is open to everyone; parents, grandparents, teachers, coaches, teens, and neighbors alike. Residents are also welcome to retake the class if they want a refresher.




