


SPECIAL ELECTION SET FOR HOUSE DISTRICT 87

When Every Second Counts

Local resident receives honor for saving his Loved One's Life with CPR

Seconds mattered when Jason Quesada's stepfather suffered a heart attack in their home last December. Thanks to Jason's calm, immediate response, his stepfather will once again spend the holidays surrounded by family—an outcome first responders credit directly to Jason's life-saving actions.

At the Fire Awards Ceremony in October, Jason received the Life-Saving Award, presented in front of his mother and, most meaningfully, his stepfather, who is alive in part because of Jason's quick thinking.

"When you start CPR right away, you give someone so much more of a chance at life," said Fire Chief Scott Freseman as he honored Jason. "It's amazing that you reacted so naturally in such a critical moment."

Chief Freseman recounted how North Palm Beach firefighters arrived to find Jason performing CPR on his stepfather. Crews shocked the patient three times before his heartbeat returned. On the way to Palm Beach Gardens Medical Center, they had to administer a fourth shock when his heart fell back into AFib.

After two weeks in the ICU, he went home because of the swift actions of both Jason and the firefighters.

As the chief retold the events, he noted that some details of that day might have been new to the patient himself. The room erupted in applause as Chief Freseman concluded: "He is now home and standing in front of us. It is absolutely amazing."

Why Immediate CPR Matters

According to the Red Cross, 70% of cardiac arrests occur at home, and a person's chance of survival drops by 10% for every minute CPR or AED use is delayed. Jason's story is a powerful reminder of how critical quick action can be.

Love of Tennis

Legacy of Impact

For North Palm Beach Tennis Center instructor Vikki Beggs, the sport that first began as a childhood supplement to ballet and swimming has become a lifelong passion and global adventure.

Raised in West Palm Beach, Beggs picked up a racquet at her parents' encouragement and discovered a talent that would take her around the world and ultimately back home to teach the next generation.

One of her most unforgettable moments came when she and her sister won a world title at the International Tennis Federation championships in South Africa.

"It was such a powerful moment," she said. "The most meaningful victories are the ones you share."

Beggs' collegiate career was equally distinguished. After being accepted into eight universities, she chose the University of Miami on a full athletic scholarship during the early years of Title IX. Miami was among the nation's top programs, with many athletes turning professional, and her success quickly opened the door to the WTA Tour.

What she expected to be a single gap year before law school transformed into an extended professional career.

"I had the good fortune to do fairly well out of the gate," she said. "I am really happy I have that experience because it is pretty amazing to travel the world and have a support system."

After she retired from the professional tour, she got a master's degree in sports psychology. She recognized how vital the mental game had been to her own success.

"It's not just about a better forehand. Players struggle with nerves, pressure and expectations. I wanted to help them through that." Her training gives her a rare blend of tactical expertise and mental-skills coaching that students rely on both on and off the court.

At the North Palm Beach Tennis Center, she's found a community that inspires her daily. "It's a fantastic team," she says. "And the facility is historic and gorgeous. It really is the crown jewel of North Palm." She especially loves meeting longtime members, some connected to the club for decades. Their stories remind her of the center's legacy.

Beggs credits many mentors with shaping her journey, including legendary coach Pancho Segura, who worked with her for five years and forever changed how she saw patterns and strategy on the Court. Billie Jean King also remains a guiding inspiration for opening doors for female athletes. Among her proudest moments is her induction into the Palm Beach County Sports Hall of Fame.

"That is the greatest hometown honor you can receive," she said.

Off the court, she is an enthusiastic traveler with a passion for history, fashion, food, languages, orchids, and spending time in nature. She jokes that she can now "order food and curse in over ten languages," which she learned during her years on the road.

After decades devoted to the sport, her enthusiasm remains unwavering. "I'm proud of my longevity," she said. "And the fact that I still truly love it."

Miss North Palm Beach is Turning Passion into Powerful Impact

When Morgan Sheehan was crowned Miss Village of North Palm Beach for 2025, her mission was clear: to positively transform the environment where she grew up.

Morgan's dedication is personal. "I am a huge scuba diver, and throughout my life, I have personally watched the health of our coral reefs decline," she shared. "Seeing that change with my own eyes is one of the biggest reasons I have dedicated myself to ocean education and restoration work."

After graduating from the University of Florida, Morgan taught locally and quickly spotted a critical knowledge gap. Many students didn't grasp the origins of their food or the vital role the ocean plays. To address this, she developed a hands-on Ocean and Agriculture Education Curriculum for local schools.

But her impact reaches beyond the classroom.

Earlier this year, she partnered with leaders in the Florida transportation industry to explore offsetting diesel pollution. Her initiative was a remarkable success, raising more than \$50,000 to fund and install an artificial reef off the coast of Florida this past May. Looking ahead, Morgan plans to continue her mission of conservation and sustainability with projects like a Village-wide art and recycling competition.

"As your Miss North Palm Beach USA, my mission is to use my platform to educate, inspire, and strengthen environmental awareness," she stated at the November 13 Council meeting. "Thank you all for welcoming me, supporting me, and giving me the opportunity to serve as a leader in our beautiful home."



Make Your Holidays Merry, Bright—and Fire Safe

The holiday season brings families together, and many homes enjoy a real Christmas tree. To keep the season safe, North Palm Beach Fire Rescue reminds residents that real trees need proper care to prevent fire hazards. Keep these simple safety tips in mind as you celebrate.

Choose a fresh tree: Select a tree with green needles that don't easily fall off when touched.

Water daily: A real tree can absorb more than a gallon of water in the first 24 hours and continues to need daily refills.

Keep it away from heat sources: Place your tree at least three feet from fireplaces, heaters, candles, or heat vents.

Check your lights: Use only UL-listed, indoor-rated lights and replace any string with frayed wires or broken bulbs. Always turn off tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

Keeping Our Parks Safe for Everyone

North Palm Beach is a community that loves its parks—and its pups. To help keep these spaces enjoyable for everyone, the North Palm Beach Police Department and Code Compliance team are reminding residents of the Village's leash rules and the important role they play in public safety.

Dogs visiting Lakeside Park or any Village park must remain on a leash that is eight feet or shorter, including retractable leashes, which must be locked at eight feet. Keeping dogs secured helps protect children, other pets, and even your own four-legged family members, since even the most well-behaved dogs can react unpredictably in busy areas.

Village officers will be paying closer attention to off-leash activity to reduce safety risks and prevent dog-related incidents.

Dogs running at large may result in citations, but the goal is always education first and safety for all.

For pups who need room to stretch their legs, Anchorage Dog Park offers a safe, designated off-leash space open daily. It's the perfect spot for dogs to run, play, and socialize freely.



Stormwater runoff is rainfall that runs over the ground's surface and into waterways.

Along its path, runoff can collect pollutants such as:

- Oils, greases, paints
- Pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers
- Detergents, cleaners
- Hazardous chemicals
- Leaves and grass clippings
- Sediments, trash and debris
- Pet waste

Even if it flows into a storm drain, the runoff almost always ends up in our waterways without treatment.



You can help!

Clean up, pick up, or relocate materials so runoff won't wash them into our waterways.

Call your local authority to report local water pollution activity.

Environmental Feature

Kayaks, Community, and Clean Water

North Palm Beach took another big step toward cleaner waterways as Kendra Zellner, Secretary of the Environmental Committee; Mary Phillips, Vice Chairwoman; and Councilman Orlando Puyol spent the day out on the water installing Vertical Oyster Gardens (VOGs) beneath residential docks.

Armed with kayaks, tools, and a shared mission, the team worked together to place VOGs in key locations throughout the Village. It was an incredible display of teamwork! The team paddled from dock to dock, demonstrating how simple actions can create meaningful environmental impact.

Vertical Oyster Gardens help improve water quality by giving oysters a place to grow. Each oyster can filter up to 50 gallons of water per day, meaning every garden installed acts like a natural water-cleaning system right in our canals and Intracoastal. The goal is to have these gardens installed throughout all of North Palm Beach, creating a network of living filters that support cleaner, clearer water and a healthier marine ecosystem.

Residents who have a dock can be part of this effort too. North Palm Beach residents are invited to request their own VOG for installation under their dock. It's an easy, hands-on way to make a difference right at home.
