

A Special Primary Election will be held on January 13, 2026, followed by a Special Election on March 24, 2026, if needed.

Serving With Paws & Purpose



The newest member of the force has four legs, a love for cuddles, and may just be the cutest officer on duty. Meet Blitz, the Police Department's therapy dog and certified morale booster.

Blitz is specially trained to provide comfort and emotional support, particularly to children who may be navigating difficult or stressful situations. One of his most important roles will be assisting children during court proceedings, where his calm presence can help ease anxiety and provide reassurance during what can be an overwhelming experience.

Blitz officially joined the team after graduating from the Paws and Stripes program in November, a nationally recognized nonprofit that rescues and trains dogs to support veterans, first responders, and communities through service and therapy work.

You may have already seen Blitz at Village events, proudly sporting a holiday sweater alongside his partner, Community Outreach Officer Jovica Tonkin, who serves as his handler. Wherever Blitz goes, attention naturally follows, and Tonkin jokes that while everyone rushes over to greet Blitz, he often finds himself chiming in with, "Hi guys, I'm also fine."

Together, the pair are a familiar and friendly presence throughout the Village, attending community events and offering support whenever it's needed most.

Whether he's greeting children at an event or simply making someone smile, Blitz helps break down barriers and reminds everyone that policing is about people. His role reflects the Department's continued commitment to compassion, outreach, and strengthening relationships within the community.

And yes—he really is a very good boy.



Community Connection

When the community shows up, even the four-legged officers feel the love. Precise Palm Home Repair, a local North Palm Beach business, is building a custom doghouse for Blitz, the Police Department's therapy dog, in support of both Blitz and the important work he does in the Village.

A Commitment to Service

Officer James Wright Honored as 2025 Officer of the Year

For Officer James Wright, serving in law enforcement is more than a job, it is a calling. Officer Wright, the Village of North Palm Beach Police Department's 2025 Police Officer of the Year, has always been driven by a desire to serve others. Guided by mentors who emphasized integrity, responsibility, and service, he found a career in law enforcement that allowed him to support people during their most challenging moments.

"I have always had a strong desire to serve my community and make a positive impact on the lives of others," he said.

During his five years with the Department, Officer Wright has taken on a variety of specialized roles. In addition to patrol duties, he served as a Field Training Officer mentoring new recruits, a member of the Special Response Team, and a Defensive Tactics instructor. These roles reflect his dedication to both professional excellence and team support.

Officer Wright takes great pride in serving the Village of North Palm Beach, noting the strong sense of community and engaged residents who make the Village a special place to work and live.

Outside of work, Officer Wright stays active through exercise, boxing, and Brazilian jiu-jitsu, where he holds a Black Belt and instructs others. Above all, he values time spent with his family, especially his son.



Serving with Integrity



Firefighter Fred Vaccaro consistently answers the call for his community and goes above and beyond in his service. As a result, being named the 2025 Firefighter of the Year came as no surprise. A 15-year veteran of the department, Vaccaro has played a leadership role in several key initiatives over the past year.

One of his most impactful contributions was serving as the lead instructor for CPR classes offered to residents, equipping them with skills that can make a critical difference in emergencies. "The fact that our residents are learning these simple yet lifesaving skills is something we are extremely proud of," Vaccaro said.

Vaccaro also served as the lead on the Fire Rescue build committee for a new rescue truck scheduled to arrive at the station in the coming months. The process spanned more than three years and required the committee to stay informed on the latest industry standards and innovations to ensure the apparatus best serves the community.

During his career, Vaccaro has received numerous awards, including a Community Impact Award from the Palm Beach North Chamber of Commerce. Beyond his accomplishments, it is his character that defines his impact in every role he serves.

"He is a person with integrity, he is sincere, a great leader, and I could go on and on," Fire Chief Scott Freseman said. "You name anything good, and that would describe him."

Within the station, Vaccaro is known for his sense of humor, but the moment he is en route to a call, he demonstrates the leadership qualities and professionalism that make him dependable in any situation. Off shift, he serves at his church, spends time with his wife and two children, and gives back to the profession as a paramedic instructor at Palm Beach State College.

The Village is fortunate to have Firefighter Vaccaro as part of its Fire Rescue team.





Finance Department Recognized for Fiscal Excellence for 36th Consecutive Year

When people hear “finance department,” they don’t usually picture laughter, teamwork, and a giant monthly crossword puzzle. But at the Village, the Finance team proudly breaks the stereotype.

With a dynamic that includes the “office mom,” a couple of energetic young-ins, and everyone in between, this group of seven shares a common goal: making sure residents understand exactly where their tax dollars go. Transparency isn’t just a buzzword here, it’s the foundation of everything they do.=

That commitment was once again recognized in November, when the Village of North Palm Beach received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for Fiscal Year 2024. It’s an honor the Finance Department has earned every single year since 1988.

“It shows our desire for transparency and our commitment to residents,” said Finance Director Erica Ramirez. “Our priority is that the information at the end of the fiscal year is easy for anyone to understand, so they know how the Village is financially run.”

The award, presented by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA), is the highest recognition in governmental finance. It honors state and local governments for producing financial reports that are not

only accurate, but clear, accessible, and accountable.

This year’s achievement carries even more meaning. Over the past year, the department experienced the unexpected loss of a beloved, long-time team member. At the same time, four staff members were new to the department, each with less than two years on the job. While grieving, onboarding, and operating understaffed, the team still met every deadline—and met it with excellence.

“Our team is very committed,” Ramirez said. “We have good character. We’re not the finance stereotype people have in their heads.”

Beyond spreadsheets and audits, the Finance Department connects through birthday lunches, friendly competition over a massive monthly crossword puzzle, and a shared sense of purpose. They’re often the last ones out of the building, quietly ensuring that the Village’s financial operations remain strong, transparent, and trustworthy.

And they’re not slowing down. The team is already hard at work on the 2025 award, aiming to continue a decades-long tradition of excellence.



Civilian of the Year **Turning Public Safety Into Community Connection**

When Olivia Glowala stepped into her role as the Village's Communications Specialist in February 2025, she didn't know exactly where the road would lead, but it didn't take long for her work to start making waves.

Tasked with creating more engaging social media and telling the story of the Village in new ways, Olivia quickly built relationships across departments and leaned into short, impactful videos. The result? Social media engagement that doubled—and in some cases tripled—across Village platforms.

One department that felt the impact almost immediately was the North Palm Beach Police Department. In November, Olivia was named Civilian of the Year at the Police Awards Banquet, recognizing her role in strengthening public safety communication and community connection.

Through campaigns like "Lock It or Lose It" and public safety messaging around e-bikes, Olivia helped translate important information into content residents actually stop scrolling to watch. She also launched the Police Department's social media channels from the ground up which didn't exist before she arrived.

"This award makes me feel special because it validates my work and shows the impact communication can have on the community," Glowala said.

One standout example is the e-bike safety video, which reached far beyond Village limits, earning more than 844,000 views and 24,000 likes.

"When I first came into the role, the Police Department didn't have their own social media channels and the tone of what was put out was very serious. It didn't align with their goals," Glowala said. "I wanted to show them the many different ways they could communicate their message effectively, recognizing that some moments call for a serious approach, while others allow for a lighter tone."

That balance has paid off. By mixing humor with responsibility, Glowala helped show the human side of policing, illustrating that officers aren't just uniforms and serious faces, but real people dedicated to the community.

"I am so grateful that they've trusted me with helping them connect with our community," she said. "We're seeing a rise in engagement because people feel connected."
