Dear North Palm Beach Residents,


This year is already speeding by, and as we move into February, the Village's event season is really kicking off.



A Legacy of SERVICE

Honoring Kristin Garrison & Jeremy Scott

Few individuals leave a legacy as deeply woven into a community as Kristin Garrison. Through decades of public service, she exemplified what it means to be a true civic steward.

Garrison served the Village of North Palm Beach with sincerity, thoughtfulness, and a genuine love for the community. She served on the Village's Planning Commission for several terms, both in the mid-1990s and again in the mid-2010s. Since joining the Village Council in 2024, she approached her role with compassion and integrity. Her leadership made a lasting and meaningful impact on the Village.

"President Pro Tem Garrison served our community with warmth, dedication, and a generous spirit that left a lasting impact," Mayor Deborah Searcy said at the January Village Council meeting, where a moment of silence was held in Garrison's memory.

Her impact was felt deeply by residents throughout the community.

"She was only a little bit older than me, but I have to admit she was kind of a role model," said Mary Phillips, a member of the Environmental Committee, during public comments at the meeting. "I really appreciated how smart, and funny, and just wonderful she was."



Garrison devoted more than 35 years of her life to public service. She served as City Manager for the Town of Gulf Stream and later spent more than 20 years with the School District as Director of Planning and Intergovernmental Relations.

Throughout her distinguished career, she was widely respected for her professionalism and unwavering dedication to the communities she served.

Garrison will always be remembered as a valued neighbor, a trusted leader, and a cherished member of the Village family.

If Jeremy Scott wasn't at work, you were likely to find him camping. An avid outdoors-man who found peace in nature, Scott brought that same grounded spirit to his work and to the people around him.

Scott joined the Village of North Palm Beach staff as the Senior Building Construction Inspector in March 2024, where he quickly became a well-known and respected member of both the organization and the community.

"He came in and integrated so easily," said Building Inspector Charlie Coates. "He knew himself, and he was completely comfortable in his own skin. He was a good egg."

Known by colleagues, residents, and developers alike as fair, approachable, and a person of high integrity, Jeremy earned widespread respect. With a strong background in electrical work and well-rounded construction knowledge, he was known not only for identifying issues on job sites but for helping residents understand how to resolve them and comply with code. This approach set him apart and strengthened trust throughout the community.

The respect Scott earned was evident at his Celebration of Life in early January, which was attended by staff, residents, and builders whose lives he had touched. At the service, his cowboy work boots were placed at the front alongside his Village badge and hat—a powerful symbol of his pride in his work and his service to the Village.

"Building Inspector Scott was a steady and valued member of our team, known for his professionalism, integrity, and dedication to the safety and quality of our community," Mayor Deborah Searcy said at the January 8 Village Council meeting, where a moment of silence was held in Scott's memory.

Outside of work, Scott loved camping, road trips, and spending time with his family. He enjoyed building things, working with his hands, and was well known for his sense of humor. At just 47 years old, he was a devoted father and husband and a cherished member of the Village family.

"He was more than a colleague," Coates said. "He was a friend. He was a fun guy to talk to and had some good stories to share. He will be missed."



Special Election Set for Tuesday, March 24

The North Palm Beach Special Election will be held on Tuesday, March 24 in conjunction with the Special General Election for State Representative District 87.

All registered voters of North Palm Beach will have the opportunity to elect a council member to the Village Council Group 4 seat. Each voter is encouraged to learn about the candidates and then go to the polls to express their preference. Municipal Elections are by group, at-large and non-partisan. Seats on the Village Council are designated by Group number. There is currently one seat open to election. On election day, residents must vote in their assigned precinct.



The North Palm Beach Country Club A Century of Golf and Community

The North Palm Beach Country Club has a rich history, beginning in 1926 as the Palm Beach Winter Club. Designed by renowned architect Seth Raynor, it was originally a destination for socialites and investors. In 1935, the club was purchased by Sir Harry Oakes, a part-time resident who recognized its potential and made it his own.

Over the years, the club changed ownership several times until a pivotal moment in 1962, when the Village of North Palm Beach purchased the club and its golf course. Under the Village's leadership, the Country Club underwent renovations, reopening to the public in 1963 as a central hub for golfers and community members alike.

In 2019, the Country Club unveiled a modern clubhouse alongside a Jack Nicklaus-designed golf course. The updated facility offers unique design elements, panoramic views, and modern amenities, solidifying its reputation as a premier public golf destination.

Throughout its history, the North Palm Beach Country Club has remained a cornerstone of the community.

- Two ways out of each room, if possible
- Clear exits—keep doors, windows, and hallways free of clutter
- A designated meeting place outside the home (mailbox, tree, or neighbor's driveway)
- Working smoke alarms on every level of the home and near bedrooms

PRACTICE MAKES A DIFFERENCE:

- Practice your plan at least twice a year, during the day and at night
- Teach everyone to get low and go if there is smoke
- Assign roles for children, older adults, and pets

Taking a few minutes now to create and practice a fire escape plan helps ensure everyone in the home knows what to do in an emergency. Starting the year prepared is a simple step that can make a life-saving difference.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS:

- Once outside, call 911
- Never re-enter a burning home

Boat GPS units are valuable, portable, and increasingly targeted by thieves especially high-end Garmin models. Taking a few simple precautions can greatly reduce the risk of theft and help keep your equipment, and your peace of mind, safe.

TIPS TO PROTECT YOUR GPS SYSTEM:

- Remove portable GPS units and take them with you when leaving the boat
- Use locking mounts or security screws for fixed GPS systems
- Cover your electronics with fitted covers to keep them out of sight
- Lock your cabin and console whenever you are away
- Avoid leaving valuables visible, even for short periods of time
- Install motion-sensor or cockpit lighting to deter theft at night
- Mark your equipment with an ID number or engrave it for identification



EXTRA PROTECTION STEPS:

- Record serial numbers and keep photos of your GPS unit for insurance and police reports
- Register your equipment with the manufacturer, if available
- Report suspicious activity around docks and marinas promptly
- A few proactive steps can make your boat a less attractive target. Protecting your GPS system helps ensure it's there when you need it most—keeping your time on the water safe and stress-free.

Their love story—and their choice of venue—reflects a deep affection for the Village of North Palm Beach and a desire to share that love with the community. To date, they are the only couple whose journey has led them to say "I do" on the steps of Village Hall...so far.

Small actions add up. Recycling right helps protect the environment and reduce costs for the Village. Together, the community can keep North Palm Beach green.




February is ideal for planting beans, carrots, peas, squash, and watermelon directly from seed.
