
And of course, we're gearing up for two of the biggest celebrations of the year.

Special Election Set for Tuesday, March 24

The North Palm Beach Special Election will be held on Tuesday, March 24 in conjunction with the Special General Election for State Representative District 87. If no candidate receives the majority vote in the March 24 election, a runoff will be held on April 7.

The Village will not have an election on March 10 because all three incumbents ran unopposed. Mayor Deborah Searcy, Vice Mayor Lisa Interlandi and Councilmember Orlando Puyol will be sworn in for another term at an upcoming meeting.

All registered voters of North Palm Beach will have the opportunity to elect a council member to the Village Council Group 4 seat. Each voter is encouraged to learn about the candidates and then go to the polls to express their preference. Municipal Elections are by group, at-large and non-partisan. Seats on the Village Council are designated by Group number. There is currently one seat open to election. On election day, residents must vote in their assigned precinct.

behind every VOTE IS A TEAM



On Election Day, a resident walks into a polling location, shows their ID, signs in, casts a ballot, collects an “I Voted” sticker, and heads back into their day.

Five minutes in and out.

But rewind six months, and you’ll find three women in Village Hall quietly preparing for that moment.

Municipal elections in the Village of North Palm Beach are led by the Clerk’s Office composed of Village Clerk Jessica Green, Deputy Village Clerk Marquetta Fells, and Records Coordinator Anna Monaco. Long before a ballot is printed or a campaign sign goes up, their work is already underway.

The team develops candidate handbooks, detailed guides filled with timelines, legal requirements, and step-by-step instructions. For someone stepping into the world of local government for the first time, the handbook becomes a roadmap.

“We are here to guide the candidates and give them the information,” Green said. She is currently the only staff member in the office who has managed a municipal election before.

“This is my first election,” Fells said. “Anything can happen. It is all about preparing for it.”

Behind the scenes, there are resolutions to draft announcing the election, budgets to finalize, and coordination with the Supervisor of Elections. The cost of democracy is not insignificant. A stand-alone municipal election — when only Village races appear on the ballot — costs approximately \$50,000. When municipal races share the ballot with state or national elections, like the March 24 special election, the cost drops closer to \$10,000. The difference largely comes down to staffing. In a stand-alone election, the Village is responsible for hiring and paying all poll workers.

There are also qualifying periods to establish, public notices to publish, physical postings required by Village code, and polling location agreements must be secured.

These tasks may seem procedural, even mundane, but without them, there is no Election Day.

Then the big day arrives. While voters see a calm and orderly process, the Clerk’s Office and Village staff assigned to polling locations have already been up for hours. Polling locations must be opened at 5:30 am, and from there, it becomes a waiting game.

“If there are any issues day of, we are on call,” Green said.

The same people who opened the polls are responsible for closing them. But the work doesn’t end when the polls close. The team waits as results are reported and then certified by the Supervisor of Elections which can take up to a week. Once certification is complete, their focus shifts to onboarding newly elected officials. Swearing-in ceremonies are arranged. Palm Beach County ethics training is coordinated. Email accounts, finance access, and communications tools are set up.

The transition from candidate to councilmember is carefully managed, another seamless moment the public may never see. So the next time a voter walks out with that small round sticker, it represents far more than five minutes.

It represents months of preparation, countless checklists, early mornings, contingency plans, and a dedicated team working quietly behind the scenes to ensure democracy in North Palm Beach runs smoothly.

“You have to be open to changing direction. Doing your best to get everything prepared,” Green said. “We are in the election Olympics, and we are going for gold.”

SCAM ALERT

BEFORE YOU SEND MONEY



Scammers are constantly finding new ways to target residents through phone calls, text messages, emails, and social media. Protect yourself by staying cautious and informed. Here are some key tips to help keep you safe from scams.



Scammers often pose as law enforcement, banks, or big companies to steal money or personal information. You might get a call about “missed jury duty” or an email asking you to update payment information. Always verify the source before responding.



Never pay with gift cards or Bitcoin. Scammers prefer these methods because they are nearly impossible to trace or recover.



Scammers often use personal information—like your name, address, or the last digits of your Social Security number—to gain your trust. Always verify the source before sharing any sensitive information.



Scammers often try to rush, overwhelm, or confuse their victims to make them act without thinking. For example, they may claim you owe taxes that must be paid immediately or pressure you to “verify” your account right away. Always take your time to verify any urgent requests.

Perfection

Fifteen gallons of chili. Twenty-five pounds of venison. One unforgettable Saturday.

More than a decade ago, Robert Lombardo entered his first chili cookoff at the Village's Hot Cars and Chili Cookoff. He was persuaded to compete by his wife's friend, but he brought something different to the table: venison chili.

He's been coming back ever since.

Year after year, Lombardo returned for the atmosphere, the camaraderie, and the hope of finally taking home first place. He had earned second a few times, but the top spot always seemed just out of reach. Until this January.

At the most recent cook-off, Lombardo didn't just win first place, he swept the competition. He won first place for Best Decorated Booth, first place for Judge's Choice, and first place for People's Choice.

This was the first clean sweep in the event's history. "I am still on a high and have not come down," Lombardo said.

For Lombardo, though, the event has always been about more than trophies. Over the years, the competitors have become friends. He can name nearly every chili team.

"I love being out there and meeting people. I would feel left out if I wasn't there," he said. "Winning is just extra." His team name, Flora Bama Venison Chili, is a nod to home and family. He's from Florida, and his wife is from Alabama. The venison recipe itself stems from his love of hunting and years spent perfecting the blend of spices and technique.

He knows venison can make some people hesitate. "Sometimes venison scares people away," he said. "But you have the health benefits of it being lean, and I know it is good."

This year, he made a few strategic tweaks. He added a secret ingredient and removed the frozen peas he traditionally used as garnish. The result? The perfect combination.

"I knew my chili had it and could win," he said. But perhaps the most meaningful part of the day wasn't the awards, it was who stood beside him. At the booth were his wife, Brina; daughter, Isabella; son, Robert; and friends Brian and Will. And in a special touch, his 81-year-old mother contributed homemade jalapeño cornbread.

It was truly a family affair.

"I am a married father with two kids, a job and a love for hunting," Lombardo said. "That is who I am."

And at this year's Hot Cars and Chili Cookoff, with 15 gallons of chili simmering and 25 pounds of venison served, that was more than enough to take home gold.

Fire Extinguishers 101: Be Ready, Stay Safe

A fire extinguisher can be your first line of defense in a small fire—but only if you know how to use it. The Fire Department wants everyone to know the simple and effective P.A.S.S. method. And remember, if a fire continues to grow, produces a lot of smoke, or makes you feel unsafe, get out and call 911 immediately.



P – Pull the pin

Unlock the extinguisher so it's ready to use.

A – Aim at the base of the fire

Target the fuel, not the flames, to put out the fire efficiently.

S – Squeeze the handle

Apply firm, steady pressure to release the extinguishing agent.

S – Sweep side to side

Move the extinguisher across the base until the fire is completely out.


