The Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections has requested that all municipalities within the county move up their qualifying period for the March municipal election to provide sufficient time for the Supervisor to send vote-by-mail ballots to overseas citizens in accordance with statutory requirements.

The new qualifying period for the Village of North Palm Beach general election in March will be the first seven (7) business days in January during regular business hours. This change will be effective for the March 2018 election, as follows:

North Palm Beach Veterans Day Ceremony



Our 5th Annual Veterans Day Ceremony will take place in Veterans Memorial Park, 303 Anchorage Drive, on Saturday, November 11, 2017 at 9:00 AM. The Village is honored to have Retired Staff Sergeant Thomas A. Matteo as our keynote speaker. Again this year, Boy Scout Troop 155, the NPB Honor Guard, and the American Red Cross will participate.



Thomas A. Matteo, retired Staff Sergeant with the United States Marine Corps, and retired Law Enforcement professional is the son of Italian immigrants, who came to America in the late 1800's from Naples, Italy. His father and mother both served in the United States military during WWII. He is a six-time recipient of the Purple Heart during several tours of duty during the Vietnam War. He served with Delta Company 1/3, With Golf Company 2/4, and Foxtrot Company 2nd Bn., 1st Marines.

Matteo was the Police Chief for two Municipal Police Departments in the State of Florida from 1976-1984 until he became an expert witness regarding police policy and procedures. He also was a consultant for the United States Treasury Department, US Customs Investigative Services, and worked on a Federal task force combating drug trafficking and money laundering in Central and South America.

Diagnosed with an Agent Orange related disease in 2005, Matteo was deemed 100 percent service connected disabled by the Veterans Administration in 2005.



He is currently the chairman of Faces of Heroes, Vietnam Warriors, Inc., a non-profit which assists other Veterans and is a Vietnam War Consultant on a film called "Wounded Heroes" about how PTSD affects a father and his son. He is also the Ambassador of the South Florida Honor Flight for Vietnam Elite Guardians.

Village Code of Ordinances, Section 18-35

Parking of Recreational, Boating, and Camping Equipment, and Trailers on Residential Properties, restricted in R-1 and R-2 residential zoning areas.

After an extensive review and consideration of the rights and interests of all residents and property owners, as well as the overall aesthetics of the Village, the Village Council adopted Ordinance 2016-07 on September 8, 2016 approving Code revisions to Chapter 18 that clarified the regulations governing the parking and storage of boats, trailers, and recreational camping equipment in the R-1 and R-2 Zoning Districts and providing for continued enforcement through the code compliance process. The Ordinance took effect on March 8, 2017, six months from the date of final adoption. Council granted an extension of time for preparation of implementation. New Code provisions include a Village registration process and a special exception process for those not meeting the maximum length and height requirements who can demonstrate that all non-dimensional requirements, including setbacks and screening, are met. Staff has created the necessary registration forms and procedures to implement these provisions, and will work with residents throughout the process and transition to code compliance. Owner shall pay the Village \$10.00 for a one-time boat and recreational vehicle registration fee. Payment must be made in person at the Anchorage Park offices located at 603 Anchorage Drive, M-F 9:00am-7:00pm, Sat. 9:00am-1:00pm. Registration was due by October 15, 2017. Code Compliance began issuing courtesy notices as of October 16, 2017. Should you have any questions, please contact Code Compliance at 561-841-3363 or 561-841-3367.

Code Section 18-33 - Definitions

For the purposes of this article, whenever the following words or terms are used herein they shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context requires otherwise:

Boat means any vessel, with or without motor propulsion, commonly used for private recreation activities, designed for travel over water, and for which a trailer is required for transportation over land. The definition of boat shall specifically include a personal watercraft as defined by state statute and shall specifically exclude those vessels not required to be titled with the state pursuant to state statute.

Recreational vehicle means any vehicle or portable structure designed primarily to provide temporary living quarters for recreation, camping or travel use, other than a light van; either a vehicular structure mounted on wheels, self-powered or designed to be pulled by another vehicle or a structure designed to be mounted upon and carried by another vehicle.

Trailer means a vehicular structure mounted on wheels designed to be pulled by another vehicle.

Business Tax Receipts Due

The CDD would like to remind all local businesses that according to Florida Statute 205.053 and Village Ordinance, all 2017/2018 business taxes were due by September 30th. Beginning on October 1st, a 10% late fee on unpaid business tax receipts went into effect. The late fee increases an additional 5% each month after October to maximum late fee of 25%. Three Good Reasons To...

Keep Sidewalks Clean

- **Safety.** A moldy or mildewed pavement surface can become a slipping hazard for pedestrians traveling our village sidewalks. These conditions can grow at a rapid pace without regular maintenance. Pressure washing is an effective way to eliminate buildup. A mixture of oxygen bleach and water may also be used for removal of stubborn stains and mold.
- **Appearance.** Maintaining sidewalks and other paved areas in an attractive, neat condition enhances the community image overall for residents and visitors alike.
- **Village Ordinance.** The adjacent property owner is responsible for the maintenance of sidewalks, per the village code Chapter 15-2 Section 305.15. Accessory Structures. Regular maintenance should include evaluation for and elimination of discoloration and conditions that may pose a hazard.

Fee Change Notification

Effective October 1st, commencing work without first securing a building permit or written approval will be four (4) times the permit fee versus the previous two (2) times a permit fee.
