

Police Department Safety Tip

Holiday Travel/Residential Burglary

December is a busy month for most people. There are several holidays, school, and work vacations that take place in December. The police department would like to provide you with some useful information on how to safeguard your home in the event that you will be traveling this holiday season. It is important to have a plan laid out prior to leaving your home for an extended period of time.

- 1) If at all possible, have somebody watch your home while you're away. Someone who can be trusted (e.g. relative, friend, neighbor etc.).
- 2) If you're unable to find someone to watch your home, make arrangements with your local post office to put a hold on your mail. Burglars often look to see mail piling up when scouting out a potential home to burglarize.
- 3) Make arrangements for any packages to be delivered to be held as well until you return. Packages sitting by the front door are considered an added bonus to burglars looking to victimize a home.
- 4) Make sure that all exterior lighting is in operation, preferably on a timer if possible.
- 5) If your home has an alarm, check to make sure that all entry/exit points for the alarm system are in operation and make sure that your alarm company has an emergency contact on file in the event that the alarm is activated and police respond.
- 6) Lastly, social media is a very popular tool where people like to share their everyday lives. Be cautious when posting about your travel plans because if this information should fall into the wrong hands it may expose you to a potential home burglary.

IMPORTANT ELECTION NOTICE NEW QUALIFYING PERIOD FOR MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

North Palm Beach has a new qualifying period for candidates seeking election to the Village Council. The qualifying period for the general election in March has been changed to the first seven (7) business days in January during regular business hours. This change will be effective for the March 2018 election and all future municipal elections in order to provide time for the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections to send vote-by mail ballots to overseas citizens in accordance with statutory requirements.



Residents must provide their own garbage/trash can and place it by their home for pickup (“side door service”). Bulk items, vegetation, and recycling should be placed curbside. Our schedule is as follows:

- Monday - Garbage, Trash, and Bulk Items
- Tuesday - Vegetation
- Wednesday - Garbage, Trash, and Bulk Items
- Thursday - Vegetation and Recycling
- Friday - Garbage, Trash, and Bulk Items

Please note that if a contractor is hired, e.g. landscaper or home remodeler, they are responsible to haul away the vegetation and construction debris.

Code of the Month

Holiday Lights, Sec. 6-112.

Exempt holiday lights and decorations, erected during the appropriate holiday season, shall comply with all building and electrical codes. Holiday lights and decorations may be erected no earlier than four(4)weeks prior to the subject holiday with the exception of the Christmas/Hanukkah holidays. Christmas/Hanukkah lights and decorations may be erected no earlier than October 15th. All holiday lights and decorations must be removed within two(2)weeks following the holidays.

WHAT THE FLOOD MAP CHANGES MEAN FOR YOU

Palm Beach County participated in a multi-year process to map its current flood risk in partnership with FEMA and other government agencies. It’s important to know the most current flood risk so both you and your community can take steps to protect yourself. Visit FEMA.gov/palmbeach to see your flood risk.

If you are in a high-risk area as of October 5, 2017, you may be required to purchase flood insurance. However, you may be eligible for cost-saving flood insurance policy options. **If you are no longer in the high-risk areas,** you may be eligible for a lower-cost policy (a “Preferred Risk Policy”).

If there is no change in your flood risk, talk to your insurance agent to ensure your home and possessions are properly covered. Note that most homeowners insurance policies do not cover damage due to flooding. If you have no coverage, it’s critical that you learn about your risk and take steps now to protect yourself.

Sec. 14-31. - Collection of residential yard waste.



(b) Requirements for collection.

(1) Loose yard waste. Loose yard waste, such as grass clippings and leaves, shall be placed in standard thirty-two (32) to fifty (50) gallon cans or sealed plastic bags, with each container weighing less than fifty (50) pounds.

(2) Branches, tree limbs, shrub clippings and palm fronds.

a. All branches, tree limbs, shrub clippings and palm fronds shall be cut into lengths not exceeding four (4) feet prior to being placed in the swale for collection. Each single item shall weigh less than fifty (50) pounds.

b. On any scheduled yard waste collection day, branches, tree limbs, shrub clippings and palm fronds shall be limited to one (1) pile not exceeding eight (8) cubic yards, measuring approximately four (4) feet wide by fifteen (15) feet long by four (4) feet tall.

(4) All providers of commercial tree trimming and/or landscape maintenance services retained to perform services within the village shall be registered with the village's community development department and shall be required to remove all yard waste generated by such tree trimming and/or landscape maintenance activities.






