Police officers ask drivers to be aware of back-to-school safety

A message from the North Palm Beach Police Department

As another summer ends and we get closer to a new school year, you can be sure that an increase in roadway traffic is sure to follow.

A major component of this increased traffic is due to the number of school buses that transport school children to and from school.

In addition, the increase in pedestrian traffic is now more prevalent as a result of children who walk to and from their bus stops.

It is important to remember that safety should always be the first priority for everyone involved.

Be mindful of the route you travel and designated school zones, which have flashing yellow lights and a decreased speed limit.

These school zones are monitored daily by police to ensure that the roads are being traveled safely by everyone who use them.



Remember, when you travel behind a school bus they make frequent stops to pick up and drop off children.




These buses are equipped with flashing lights and stop signs to warn drivers of each stop they are about to make.

It is against the law to pass a school bus in either direction when this equipment is activated, so be mindful when you see a school bus coming to a stop. School buses stop at all railroad crossings as well, which may temporarily affect traffic flow.

You also want to use caution if passing a school bus that appears to have completed a stop because children may unintentionally attempt to cross the street and may not be immediately visible to you.

Stay alert, and expect them to act like kids!

By keeping these tips in mind, we're all better prepared on how to safely share with school buses and their passengers.



Village Council Budget Workshops

The Village annual budget is a financial document that accounts for public money coming in and being spent during the fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1 and ends Sept. 30. It shows how money will be allocated for police and fire rescue, sanitation, street maintenance, parks and recreation, the Village library and more.

Each summer, a proposed annual budget is developed that follows Village Council goals to meet the needs of Village residents. The public’s desired level of services is considered, as well as staffing levels needed, technology needs, equipment and capital improvements.

TRIM notices

The Village’s budget process complies with Florida’s Truth in Millage law, called TRIM. TRIM requires disclosure to the public of the rates and amount of taxes that will be assessed in the upcoming year.

Every Village department works throughout the summer to establish the proposed budget. This proposal shows all the sources of income the Village receives, and the expenses expected in the next year.

Then the Council sets a tentative maximum millage rate and sends that information the County Property Appraiser, who in turn notifies property owners of the proposed rate

and the dates of the hearings at which it will be accepted, rejected or lowered. This way, citizens have time to calculate how property tax rates will affect them, and they can publicly share their thoughts at two September budget hearings.

During budget workshop meetings, Council members review Village finances and make changes to ensure services are provided at an appropriate millage rate. The proposed budget is then revised to incorporate these changes and the millage rate is adjusted accordingly.

Once the tentative millage rate is adopted, it can be lowered before the final budget hearing but can’t be increased (without an additional notice to each taxpayer).

In addition to the Village proposed millage rate, the TRIM notices sent to residents by the Property Appraiser also include the proposed rates for every local governmental agency that charges a property tax. In fact, two-thirds of the total property taxes typically paid by Village property owners go to other government entities, such as the School District and Palm Beach County.



Where does Village money come from?

Understanding where Village funds come from is the first step in developing a budget plan. In other words, revenues are the key to developing the Village’s budget.

The Village generates revenue from several sources to fund the services it provides, compensate its employees and pay debt and other obligations.


Budget discussion schedule

How is Village money spent?

Village government is labor intensive, especially for operations supported by the General Fund. North Palm Beach makes most of its expenditures (approximately 63%) on the employees who deliver municipal services.



Country Club Update

Construction on the Village Country Club is progressing in several key areas at once. Major systems such as electrical, air conditioning, and windows are either in place or are being installed, though not ready for use yet.

On the interior, dry wall crews, electricians and plumbers are working simultaneously. Outside, the parking lot is being constructed with curbing being poured and formed. Additionally, workers are continuing to install drainage fixtures and piping that will reduce the possibility of flooding during heavy rainfall.

The roof has been “dried in,” meaning that rain does not penetrate the building because sheathing and sealants are in place, though the final architectural roof shingles are not yet installed.

In the parking lot, the traffic light entry at Yacht Club Drive has been reconfigured. Vehicles that enter are now routed between the two large ficus trees at the front entrance, then into the driving range parking area. Once the building opens, a driveway will lead from the trees to the covered porte cochere at the front of the building.

Also, work on the pool continues with an extensive renovation that includes a pump room make-over, new surfacing, electrical systems and plumbing, as well as a new deck. Work on a locker room building by the pool continues, and crews are installing a splash pad area for small children.

New landscaping crew on site

The golf course’s new grounds-keeping contractor, BrightView, has begun improvements to the landscaping. Cart paths are getting trimmed, and palm trees are all trimmed to Nicklaus Design standards.

Also, irrigations systems are being adjusted to maximize the quality of the new grass.

During recent heavy rains, several bunker areas of the golf course were washed out by erosion. The Village expects insurance to cover the cost of repairs and is working with BrightView to re-shape and re-sod the bunkers with a specialized grass called 419 Bermuda.

Allan's Answers

Golf's Principles:

Body Aim — it's one of the simplest things that has a definitive influence on the path of the golf club.



Many golfers aim the clubface and their body in different directions – sometimes it will work, but many times it does not (two wrongs do not always make a right)

Two things to check to improve your fundamentals:

Is the clubface aimed to the target?

Is your upper body (shoulder aim) parallel to your intended line of flight.

Fundamentals are always important for the long haul.

Fundamentals remind me of a quote that I learned early on in my golf career: “You never see a bad player with a good grip, but you can occasionally see a good player with a bad grip”.

The Country Club is not selling summer membership in 2019, nor will we be participating in reciprocal play unless our golf course is closed for maintenance.



Florida's back-to-school tax-free holiday is August 2-6

A reminder from Palm Beach County Constitutional Tax Collector Anne M. Gannon

From August 2 to August 6, catch a tax break on back to school essentials such as clothing, backpacks, shoes, tablets and other supplies. The tax exemption applies to specific clothing and footwear that cost \$75 or less, certain school supplies that cost \$15 or less, and personal computers and related accessories that cost \$1,000 or less. These items will be exempt from sales tax when purchased during this time. Mark your calendar and get ready to save!

Protect Yourself From Car Thieves



Park in areas with good lighting

Consider installing a GPS tracking system

Do not leave car running and unattended

Install a loud alarm and a visible steering wheel locking device

Don't leave anything that would attract attention. An ashtray of coins is a pot of gold to a thief!

Do not leave spare key in or near your car

Doors and windows locked at all times

If you have side mirrors that fold in, ensure they do so when locked. Thieves look for unfolded mirrors, which suggest an unlocked car with the key inside

If you see something suspicious, CALL 911!

Village of North Palm Beach Police Department

Residential garbage, recycling and vegetation pickup

The Village provides trash collection services three days a week for household garbage, two days a week for vegetation, and once a week for recyclables.

Residents must provide their own trash cans and place them outside for “side door service.” Bulk items, vegetation, and recycling should be placed by the curb. Everything should be ready for pick up by 7 a.m.

And whenever a holiday falls on a Thursday, bulk and recycling pick-up will be done on the Tuesday before. This way, those items will not be left outside for nearly two weeks.

Vegetation, trash or bulk items that come from any business or are generated by a hired contractor, such as a landscaper or home remodeler, must be hauled away from the property by the contractor.

Business taxes due by Sept. 30 for Village and County tax receipts

Florida law, as well as the Village and Palm Beach County Codes of Ordinances require businesses to pay for business tax receipts by September 30. North Palm Beach-based businesses are required to get both a business tax receipt from the Village and a separate business tax receipt from Palm Beach County government. This includes home-based businesses.

Code Sec. 17-20. - Business tax receipt renewal

“All business tax receipts issued hereunder may be renewed without penalty no later than September 30 by application of the receipt holder. Receipts not renewed by October 1 shall be considered delinquent and subject to a delinquency penalty of ten (10) percent of the full year business tax for the month of October, plus an additional five-percent penalty for each month of delinquency thereafter until paid. The total delinquency penalty shall never exceed twenty-five (25) percent of the full year business tax for that applicant, in addition to the business tax set forth herein.”

A Avoid Heatstroke

Avoid heatstroke-related injury and death by never leaving a child alone in a car, not even for a minute. And make sure to keep your car locked when you're not inside so kids don't get in on their own.



C Create Reminders

Keep a stuffed animal or other memento in your child's car seat when it's empty, and move it to the front seat as a visual reminder when your child is in the back seat. Or place and secure your phone, briefcase or purse in the backseat when traveling with your child.



T Take Action

If you see a child alone in a car, call 911. Emergency personnel want you to call. They are trained to respond to these situations.
