Village gets excellent rating for fire safety

The Village was recently notified that its ISO Fire Rating is again at nearly the best level it can be.

The rating is given by a company called Insurance Services Office, and is recognized nationally as a measure that calculates how well prepared a community and its fire protection services are to put out fires.

The scale runs from 1 to 10, with 10 being the worst and 1 being the best. The Village was rated at 2, which is an excellent score.

The obvious benefit to residents and businesses is that the score reflects the ability of the Fire Department to minimize the damage caused by fires. But the great rating also is good because homeowner insurance companies use it to determine rates. The better the ISO score, the lower the financial risk of fire damage to buildings, which means savings for the homeowner.

The ratings are done every five years, and the 2014 rating also was a "2" for the Village. About 30 years ago, the Village had a rating of 7, which is not

very desirable, so efforts to improve the score have been ongoing for many years.

Fire Chief JD Armstrong says there are many reasons the Village rating has improved over the years.

He said those reasons include the hard work and continuous training of the Firefighters and Paramedics,



the support and commitment of the Village Council, the administrative efforts of the Village and Fire Department, an effective "auto-aide" agreement with nearby fire departments in Palm Beach Gardens and Palm Beach County, and

the strong maintenance efforts by Seacoast Utility Authority to ensure a reliable water supply and strong water pressure throughout the Village.

Residential garbage, recycling and vegetation pickup

No residential trash pickup on Labor Day, Monday, September 2nd

The Village provides trash collection services three days a week for household garbage, two days a week for vegetation, and once a week for recyclables.

Residents must provide their own trash cans and place them outside for "side door service." Bulk items, vegetation, and recycling should be placed by the curb. Everything should be ready for pick up by 7 a.m.

And whenever a holiday falls on a Thursday, bulk and recycling pick-up will be done on the Tuesday before. This way, those items will not be left outside for nearly two weeks.

Vegetation, trash or bulk items that come from any business or are generated by a hired contractor, such as a landscaper or home repair person, must be hauled away from the property by the contractor. Local contractors should know this already.

Manatee gets needed help from Village Marine Unit

Earlier this summer, Officer Michael Abramczyk of the Village Police Department was working the Marine Unit when he noticed a manatee by the Parker Bridge that was up against some rocks and in distress.

He called the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, which then sent three biologists to assist. Officer Abramczyk and the FWC crew gently towed the manatee to the Anchorage Park Marina.

Then, with the assistance of residents, they loaded manatee into a specially equipped FWC manatee rescue truck

and sent it to the Miami Seaquarium for help.

Officer Abramczyk was told that if he had not found the manatee and

intervened, it would have drowned because it's tail was injured, and it would not have been able to surface for air.



Firefighters, police providing “hometown” service to Village

Engine 67 of the Village Fire Department recently responded to a cat stuck in the storm drain near the Parker Bridge.

Firefighters lifted the drain cover, but were unable to reach the cat, so they had an idea not taught in the fire academy — They purchased a can of cat food and brought it back to the scene! Eventually, the kitten was enticed by the food and came close enough for the firefighters to make the grab and save the day.

The crew involved was Lt. Jake Stone, Firefighter Paramedic Ryan Moeller, Firefighter Paramedic Bill Smith, with help from Police Officer Corrine Dwyer from the Village Police Department.

It was another example of how Village firefighters and police officers make the extra effort to serve “The Best Place to Live Under the Sun.”

Country Club Update

Progress on the Country Club is moving quickly, with a grand opening now scheduled for November 1. Extensive work is continuing in the parking lot, on the pool deck, in the pool and pump room and within the building.

Crews are finishing the roof work while electricians, plumbers, dry wall hangers, carpenters and window

and door specialists are all working on the site daily. Landscaping of the property has also begun, with the first palm trees now planted outside the patio and restaurant areas facing the golf course.

Additional modifications are being made by Farmer's Table to the patio area that will include air conditioning, windows and kitchen improvements.

November 1st and 2nd will be our two-day grand re-opening party for the new clubhouse. Music, food, beverage, sports, socializing and FUN are the main ingredients of the weekend.

We are still in the final planning stages, but staff is working on a 27-hole, two-person team tournament: with a 9-hole Friday afternoon scramble followed by 18 holes on Saturday.

We also will have a special guest, our Golf Course Architect, Jack Nicklaus, is scheduled to be in attendance on Friday evening.

Kids, dogs on Golf Course? Please keep an eye on them

While it's great that families can enjoy the beautiful Village golf course together, it's important to remember that it is a golf course and not a playground — or a dog park.

For safety reasons, and for the protection of the golf course landscaping, the Village requests that all non-golfers stay off of the course between 7:30 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Dog walkers are required to bring disposable bags and properly dispose of waste, and everyone knows it's not fair to leave dog droppings on the course (yep, this really happens). Golf course management does not want to exclude all non golfers and dogs because of the actions of a few people.



After hours, kids are not permitted to be on the greens or bunkers (sand traps) under any circumstances. While those things seem like fun, the maintenance crew works hard to keep the place looking great, and the additional traffic adds to their work.

The Country Club is not selling summer membership in 2019, nor will we be participating in reciprocal play unless our golf course is closed for maintenance.


Instead, we will be offering a Frequent Player Card for \$545.70. It allows 12 rounds until Sept. 30, 2019.
